The Fair Use Act and the Audio Home Recording Act of 1992 come to our rescue to answer this question.

It is made clear though that you must be the current owner of the game and will not distribute it for profit or otherwise.

Although the name is called the "Audio Home Recording Act of 1992", it can be applied to any sort of digital recording, including but not limited to movies, music, software and games.

The same act also states however that the companies creating these games can apply all sorts of copy-protection methods to prevent people from copying or backing up their games.

In other words, they can make it a living nightmare for you to back up that precious wii game.

If you can somehow manage to break through this copy protection barrier, you can get into no legal hot water.
