

Grow Your Own Fresh Fruit With An Indoor Fruit Tree

If you enjoy fresh fruit picked right from the tree, have you ever considered owning your own fruit tree? You can even own an indoor kumquat tree! If you're worried how tall they grow, don't be ... indoor fruit trees top off at 10 to 12 feet maximum, and only reach that height if they're never pruned.

How Does An Indoor Fruit Tree Arrive At My Home?

When you purchase an indoor fruit tree, expect it to arrive in a standard planting container, usually a 5 gallon size container. There is no specific season for shipping indoor fruit trees - they can be bought and shipped at any time of year.

How To Care For An Indoor Fruit Tree

Since indoor fruit trees are hardy, they are relatively easy care and suitable for even beginning gardeners. While growers always include specific indoor fruit tree growing instructions, in general there are just a few things to keep in mind. Give your indoor fruit tree plenty of sun exposure, and don't over water. Also, follow specific instructions for your type of indoor fruit tree.

What Is The Fruit Yield From An Indoor Fruit Tree?

You'll normally receive several pounds of fruit from an indoor fruit tree annually. Of course, actual yield depends upon how well the tree is cared for, as well as the specific type of indoor fruit tree you own.

Other Indoor Fruit Tree Tips

Sometimes an indoor fruit tree will benefit from spending a few months outdoors, in the warm weather. An indoor fruit tree will enjoy time spent on a patio or balcony. When fall temperatures arrive, bring the tree back indoors. Also, a specially formulated citrus fertilizer is useful. These fertilizers are formulated specially for indoor fruit trees and are available online or via specialty garden centers.
