

## Indoor Lemon Trees And Container Fruit Trees

Lemon meringue pie, anyone? If you enjoy cooking with lemons or even just using them to make lemonade, consider an indoor lemon tree. Indoor lemon trees are just one of many types of container fruit trees, any of which will fit comfortably in your home and will produce a bountiful fruit crop with minimal care.

There are several types of indoor lemon trees available to you. Perhaps the most well known indoor lemon tree is the Meyer lemon tree, which offers several sub varieties. The Meyer lemon tree is a favorite because it is hardy and produces several pounds of fruit per year.

While you'll likely be pleased with any indoor lemon tree, the dwarf Meyer lemon tree produces lemons which actually are shaped more like oranges. Their fruit is larger than normally produced by indoor lemon trees, with sweeter juice. They are compact enough to be shipped in one gallon containers, the smallest for any container fruit trees.

The dwarf Ponderosa lemon tree is another favorite. The most interesting aspect of this indoor lemon tree is the size of its fruit - usually 1 1/2 to 2 pounds. Another benefit of the dwarf Ponderosa lemon tree is the fragrance of its blooms. They almost serve as an air freshener, with a very fresh and pleasing aroma.

When you purchase a container fruit tree, the grower will ship your tree very close to fruiting age. That means you'll be able to enjoy your first fruit yield within a few weeks of arrival at your home. With proper care, an indoor lemon tree will yield several pounds of fruit per year. Also, indoor lemon trees are extremely affordable, usually ranging from \$30 to \$50.

Indoor lemon trees and container fruit trees are a perfect way to get a loved one started in gardening. Indoor lemon trees are easy care container fruit trees and the beginning or advanced gardener will be delighted with the fruit yield. Another plus is that indoor lemon trees can be grown just about anywhere - you don't have to live in a warm climate to grow any container fruit trees.

If you don't have much gardening experience, don't worry. An indoor lemon tree basically needs sunlight and water. Any special care instructions are supplied by the grower, and even these are minimal and occasional. And, an indoor fruit tree doesn't have to be kept indoors in the warm months. Feel free to take it outside on your patio or balcony.

Usually, hours of sunlight and moderate water are all you'll need to do. On occasion, you'll need to prune the tree, which is a very easy process. Doing so will result in productive yields of fruit every year, and a healthy, vibrant indoor lemon tree that is a proud addition to your home.
