

Installing Wooden Floors And Care Tips

Hardwood floors can really change the look of a home. It used to be that were difficult and very time consuming to install but that is no longer true. Almost anyone can lay a hardwood floor with the new wood flooring kits sold in hardware stores. All a person need to do is snap them together. You can choose from a variety of wood types, too, so you are not limited in what type of hardwood flooring you can install. Many people still hesitate, though, because they fear they will be hard to care for, but, again that is not true. You just need to understand the basics of hardwood floor care.

The Right Care

Your new hardwood flooring is easy to care for if you know what to do. All it takes is some background knowledge and you can keep your floors looking nice without a lot of hassle. You should start by finding a good hardwood floor cleaner. This will help keep the wood looking new and shiny. You should also make sure to completely read the manufacturers direction on how to care for you flooring. It may suggest a particular floor cleaner that you should use. Some floor types may not even require a special cleaner and can be cleaned with soap and water. They manufactures instructions should explain care quite thoroughly. Many of the new flooring types are low maintenance. The style that simply click together are usually pre varnished and have a protective coat already applied which make cleaning it a breeze. If you did not get care instructions with your flooring then the employees at the local hardware store can probably give you advice on care.

Older homes that already have wood flooring are likely to be a bit trickier to care for. These floors are not varnished and protected like the new flooring. They will require a cleaner with wax in it to help maintain shine. They also must be stripped occasionally to remove waxy build up residue.

For all wood flooring, keeping it clean is the major way to prevent damage. Dirt and other debris that remains on the floor can be tracked around and may scuff or harm the flooring. It should be swept or dust mopped daily to make sure all debris is cleaned up.

Hardwood flooring of any kind is meant to last a lifetime. It is durable flooring but just requires some good care. You should not be consumed with your hardwood floor care, just aware that you have to be a bit more diligent in it than with other flooring types.
